The real ship:

- Build 1956 by H.C. Christensen Staalskibsvaerft in Marstal, Denmark
- One of a series of 18 coasters (so called Caroliner) that were build after WW2 as denmark lost many ships in wartime and the remaining rest was quite old. Out of this series are two ships preserved in Denmark: MS SAMKA, Marstal und MS CAROLINE S., Svendborg
- Length 33,45 m – width 6,50 m – displacement BRT 240 to

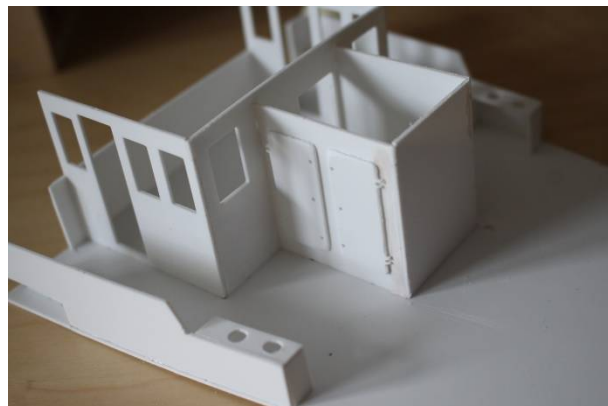
The model:

- scale 1:50
- length 67 cm – width 13 cm – displacement 2 kg
- laminated GRP-hull (3 layers)
- the model can be operated with radio control. The deck with the wheelhouse and the loading hatch give ample space to the inside.



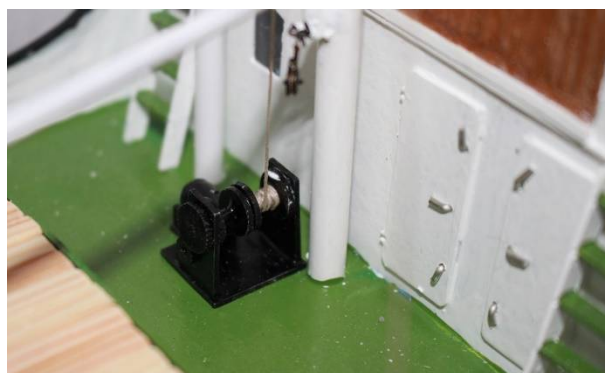
The kit contains:

- GRP-hull (3 layers / Epoxi)
- drawings 1:50 (sideview and deckplan)
- construction manual (with many pictures)
- Polystyrene parts (1 und 1,5mm) for decks, superstructure
- windows (acrylic glas)
- brass rods for railings
- brass load beams
- polystyrene profiles and tubes
- teak for wheelhouse, doors, handrails
- pinewood for hatch cover
- anchor windlass, hand winches, beam winches
- dinghi, vents, anchor, bollards, lanterns, rigging screws, blocks and decals

To complete the model kit you will need additional stuff: prop shaft, propeller, paint, glue, yarn and in case you want to operate it by radio control all RC-equipment plus motor.
